

Fox

The most common foxes found in New Jersey are the Red Fox and the Gray Fox. These animals cause problems for people since they prey on small animals such as chipmunks, field mice and moles, and even domestic animals like cats. They have the potential to carry disease including rabies. Foxes are attracted onto residential properties due to the well-maintained lawns which can be a possible habitat for them to live in and find prey. Foxes are not generally aggressive towards humans. People who are uncomfortable with fox sightings should remove attractions, put up fences, and perform scaring techniques.
