Mayor & Council Update: Council discussing stormwater management issues not related to the ordinance. Encouraged everyone to attend the Fourth of July picnic. The Environmental Commission is working on a tree survey. Roosevelt has the most trees in Monmouth County.

Environmental Commission Update: No report.

Ms. Donato explained Ordinance 2024-04, which amends the Borough's stormwater management regulations to be in compliance with the State mandate. There are two parts to the ordinance: the requirements for the MS4 permit and requirements for major development. She and Carmela Roberts felt the draft ordinance for the State may not be as restrictive as the Board would like. Mr. Corini referenced some ideas he and Ms. Roberts had for possible amendments. Mr. Septak offered a motion to authorize Ms. Donato and Ms. Roberts to work together to come up with a draft amendment to the ordinance for consideration, which was seconded by Mr. Hartley and approved unanimously. Mr. Hartley offered a motion to recommend to the Mayor and Council to adopt the ordinance as is in order to be in compliance with the State mandate, which was seconded by Mr. Septak and approved unanimously.
